Holland

Rotterdam is the second largest City in the Netherlands one of the largest ports in the world. The population of the city was 616,250 in 2012. Rotterdam is one of Europe's most vibrant and multicultural cities. Almost half of the population is foreign-born citizens. Rotterdam is a major actor within the Greater Rijnmond area and plays a significant role in both the regional and local youth policy. The city has a lot of expertise in the prevention of young people falling out of the established systems. In this partnership Rotterdam can significantly contribute to the development of skills and learning programmes in this field.

Belgium

The organisation Riso brings the perspective of social vulnerable groups to the surface and influences policy based on this perspective. Together with these groups, Riso initiates projects concerning accommodation, isolation, education etc. via community work. An important target group of the organisation is youth at risk. The project "Never mind" works with young people with past experiences

of care. Their perspective is not systematically taken into consideration. Never mind like to change this by participating in this project.

Sweden

The city of Västerås is habitat of 140 000 and is situated west of Stockholm. The services for Leisure and Preventative work together with Upper secondary schools are active in this project.

The project Voices of youth would allow the city of Västerås and all activities it provides the support to develop work around participation and communication with young people. It is of specific interest as the project focus on young people that are not involved in traditional ways of working with for example student councils. The city of Västerås has a lot of exciting and innovative projects to show but also a lot to learn from others.

Summary of the planned partnership

The overall objective of this project is to address the issues concerning the difficulties that the European countries and institutions have in finding ways for political and social involvement of young people at risk of exclusion, as well as young people who are already socially excluded through for example drop-out from school or apprenticeships and employments, housing and relation problems. We intend to identify skills, methods and structures needed to boost true participation and inclusion of the voices of vulnerable youngsters in democratic processes, in policy making, care planning and in daily life decisions. In doing so we want to improve our own skills to work in a democratic and inclusive way. Increasing participation of vulnerable youngsters at all levels may also hopefully be a small contribution towards combating poverty and decreasing drop-outs from schools in accordance with the Europe 2020 agenda.

The partners intend to gather "best practice" ways of approaching the issues through exchange of experiences, in study visits and discussions, in and between meetings. We also intend to learn from young people and take into consideration their input from their life experiences and from their participation in the

study visits and discussions. We intend to evaluate the data that is gathered and identify the skills, methods and structures that lead to the desired outcomes and set out criteria's for elements needed in the non-formal training of professionals who work in the different institutions designed to work with young people, such as social workers, teachers, trainers and youth workers, and also the training of youngsters themselves.
